This was one of in total five BALTSPACE case studies, that studied context-specific aspects (e.g. challenges and enablers) of cross-scale and transboundary / policy and sector / stakeholder / knowledge integration in MSP of the Baltic Sea Region. The specifics of the pan-Baltic case study included, that it zoomed out beyond the national level, focussing on MSP integration at the international, Baltic Sea-wide level (e.g. formal and informal transboundary communication, international projects, bilateral interaction, international fora on MSP). In a sub-case investigation, the specific process of the establishment of the Guideline for the implementation of the ecosystem-based approach in MSP within the HELCOM-VASAB MSP WG was studied in further detail.
